



# Seven Pearls Foundation Sponsored Internship Pilot Program for Academic Credit

**Location:** Nonprofit Location or Virtual

Duration: One Full Semester Per Academic Year (Spring, Fall, or Summer)

**Hours per Week:** Determined by Academic Program Requirements

Funded Internships Available: 5 funded internships available

**Compensation:** \$2,000 for Participation + \$1,000 for Program Implementation

Internships Available Starting: Fall Semester 2026

### **About the Funding Organization:**

Seven Pearls Foundation is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization committed to empowering students through education, advancing community development, and supporting youth leadership. With this initiative we provide undergraduate and graduate students opportunities to gain hands-on experience in the education sector.

### **Funded Internships Available:**

There are 5 funded internships available throughout the United States, Internships are funded by Seven Pearls Foundation to support students in fulfilling their academic internship requirements.



# Credit for Change Internships

## Sponsored Internship Program for Academic Credit

### **Internship Overview:**

This internship provides an invaluable opportunity for students seeking academic credit while working with an education-based nonprofit. Interns will contribute to impactful projects that serve underserved communities, schools, and students, gaining experience in education administration, program development, community outreach, and operations.

#### **Compensation:**

- \$2,000 stipend for participation.
- \$1,000 grant to develop and implement a program for the nonprofit, aligned with the Seven Pearls Foundation's mission.

### Placement Organization Criteria:

- Internship placements must be with organizations that have an educational mission, or education as part of its mission.\* This ensures the intern's work contributes to the growth and empowerment of individuals through education, in alignment with the Foundation's focus on academic achievement, leadership, and community development.
- The organization must have a major project underway during the internship period in which the student will play a key role in support of her degree program.
- The organization must provide an objective evaluation of the students' efforts to the faculty member/University Internship Coordinator.



# Credit for Change Internships

## Sponsored Internship Program for Academic Credit

### Location and Work Setting:

- In-person participation is preferred for direct engagement with the community and staff.
- Virtual participation may be considered for students facing hardship, due to geographic limitations.
- The intern must be on site on the day of the execution of their assigned project (portions of the \$2,000 stipend may be applied to travel expenses).

#### **Cohort & Support Structure:**

Interns will be part of a cohort, with monthly check-in meetings for collaboration, progress updates, and professional development.

### **Responsibilities:**

- Assist in developing, implementing, and evaluating education programs.
- Support educational material creation and outreach efforts.
- Conduct research on education trends and best practices.
- Provide administrative support.
- Develop and implement a program for nonprofit.
- Contribute to team meetings and strategic planning.



# Credit for Change Internships

## Sponsored Internship Program for Academic Credit

### **Qualifications:**

- Open to students of all majors and degree programs at accredited four-year institutions that require an internship for graduation.
- Currently enrolled as an undergraduate or graduate student.
- Strong communication skills and the ability to work independently and as part of a team.
- Passion for education, social justice, and community service.
- Familiarity with Microsoft Office Suite (experience with databases a plus).

#### What You'll Gain:

- Academic credit toward your degree program.
- Funding for you and program development.
- Hands-on experience in education and community impact.
- Mentorship and professional development.
- Networking opportunities with professionals in education and nonprofits.



# Credit for Change Internships

## Sponsored Internship Program for Academic Credit

### **Application Process:**

Students should follow the steps below to apply:

- 1. Contact your professor and university's internship office to confirm the internship aligns with academic credit requirements.
- 2. The internship office will reach out to Seven Pearls Foundation to inquire about internship availability.
- 3. The Foundation will respond directly to the University Internship Coordinator regarding availability.
- 4. Based on availability, identify a nonprofit organization for placement and submit the application to the University Internship Coordinator.
- 5. The University Internship Coordinator will provide evidence that the student's application meets the necessary requirements.
- 6. Funds will be distributed to the student and placement organization once placement confirmation is received.

#### **Special Notices:**

- The internship is funded by Seven Pearls Foundation. The educational institutions offer academic credit.
- There are 5 scholarships available throughout the U.S., allocated regionally on a first-come, first-serve basis.
  The Foundation will update its website to reflect availability; however, schools may follow up to determine availability.
- The Foundation is not involved in the selection or grading process.
